**MUSIC NOTES**

The Choir Introit, **“Be still and know that I am God”** from the Iona community in Scotland is a meditation on the first of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, “I am the Lord your God...you shall have no other gods before me,” and the words of Jesus in the book of John, “You are my friends if you do what I command you.”

George Wallace Briggs (1875-1959) was a canon of Leicester and Worcester cathedrals, and a chaplain in the Royal Navy, and wrote many hymns and prayers to be used in schools. **“Now is eternal life”** (TIS 385) is a strong statement of our ongoing life with Christ, both in the present, and beyond death; the emphasis is on the first word of the hymn, “Now!” (“Eternal life is Now”).

Contemporary hymn writer Brian Wren (b. 1936) wrote the hymn **“When Christ was lifted from the earth”** (TIS 248) in 1970 in response to a controversy in an English congregation where he was ministering. Originally titled “Living together,” the hymn paints a vivid picture of the love of Christ which extends and unites across all divides.

The hymn, **“One in Christ, we meet together”** was written by English Methodist minister and prolific hymn writer Fred Pratt Green for a Service at Guildford Cathedral in January 1973. It is a reflection on our unity in Christ: “He alone, our Lord and brother, makes us one in mind and heart.”

The hymn **“We are your people”** (TIS 468), also by Brian Wren, was written for the new hymnal of the United Reformed Church. Of the text Wren writes: “Mutual love is at the heart of the Church. Practising it among ourselves prepares us to go beyond ourselves.” The hymn takes the form of a corporate prayer for God’s help in serving our neighbours, our community, and each other.

The much loved hymn, **“Make me a channel of your peace”** (TIS 607) is based on a Latin text beginning with the words: “Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,” attributed to St Francis of Assisi (1182-1226). It was set to music by Sebastian Temple (1928-1997), a BBC journalist, composer, and Secular Franciscan. The text has been described as “a prayer about transformation - the movement away from darkness to light, from despair to hope.”

In March 1964, discussions which had aimed to facilitate a “reunion” of the Church of England and Methodist Churches failed, and the week concluded with a Service of thanksgiving and dedication in Manchester Cathedral. No existing hymn seemed appropriate to conclude the Service, so Bishop Stewart Cross wrote **“Father, Lord of all creation”** (TIS 631). The hymn is a prayer for love for one another, and unity in the love of God.

**FIRST READING: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26**

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, ‘Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.’ So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.’ So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, ‘Lord, you know everyone’s heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.’ And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

**SECOND READING: 1 John 5:9-13**

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth. I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word.
