

Worship Music Notes for Sunday 14th July, 2019

“God has spoken by his prophets” (TIS 158) is one of the best-known hymns of George Wallace Briggs (1875-1959,) English hymn writer and Anglican clergyman, and was written to celebrate the publication of the Revised Standard Version translation of the Bible in 1952. The verses in turn focus on each person of the

Trinity, and trace the spoken Word of God from the early time of the prophets, through to the present age. The hymn is sung to the music of Beethoven’s “Ode to joy.”

English Congregational minister Alfred Frederick Bayly (1901-1984) wrote a series of seventeen hymns on Old Testament prophets. **“What does the Lord require?”** (TIS 618) is based on Micah 6: 6-8, asking questions and stating commands as if Micah were a modern-day prophet. There is a subtle shift in the refrains: the refrains for verses 1-4 contain a command: “Do justly, love mercy; walk humbly with your God; the verse 5 refrain concludes with a corporate response: “Then justly, in mercy, we’ll humbly walk with God.”

Contemporary British hymn writer, Graham Kendrick (b. 1950) wrote **“Beauty for brokenness”** (TIS 690) in 1993 for the 25th anniversary of the charity, Tearfund. The hymn was inspired by a visit Kendrick had made to India in 1992, and his perception of the contrast between Indian poverty and Western affluence. He writes: “ I composed this with a concern in mind that the theme of God’s heart for his suffering world should be more prominent in regular worship.” The Refrain is based on Psalm 113: 7, 8: “He raises the poor from the dust, and lifts the needy from the ash heap to make them sit with princes.”

“God of freedom, God of justice” (TIS 657) was written in 1980 by New Zealand hymn writer, Shirley Murray (b.1931) for a Service for Prisoners of Conscience, which was organised by Amnesty International’s Campaign Against Torture. The hymn is sung to the music of a 17th century French folk song from the region of Picardy, “La ballade de Jésus Christ,” which is a regional adaptation of the story of the rich man and Lazarus.

And Amaziah said to Amos, 'O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there;
but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom.'

Then Amos answered Amaziah, 'I am no prophet, nor a prophet's son; but I am a herdsman, and a dresser of sycamore trees,

and the Lord took me from following the flock, and the Lord said to me, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

'Now therefore hear the word of the Lord .

You say, "Do not prophesy against Israel,
and do not preach against the house of Isaac."

Therefore, thus says the Lord :

"Your wife shall become a prostitute in the city,
and your sons and your daughters shall fall by the sword,
and your land shall be parcelled out by line;
you yourself shall die in an unclean land,
and Israel shall surely go into exile away from its land." '

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae: Grace to you and peace from God our Father. In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow-servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit. For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Hymn: 618 What does the Lord require?

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ,
according to Luke chapter 10 beginning at verse 25.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.' But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'



TOUR TO THE HOLY LAND



Are you interested in travelling to the Holy Land? We are seeking expressions of interest from anyone who would like to travel, with Father Daniel, to the Holy Land in February 2020.

There are two itineraries to choose from, one taking **14 days at a cost of \$4850** and the other taking **16 days at a cost of \$4950** (Twin share. A single supplement would apply for solo travellers). This fare would include air travel from Brisbane and all transport, sightseeing and accommodation costs as well as almost all meals.

Depending on the number of people who are interested, we will need to choose which tour is the most desirable and go with that one.

Option 1: This is a 14 day tour which includes travel and touring in the Holy Land.

Option 2: This is a 16 day tour which offers all the sights and wonders of the Holy Land but at a more relaxed pace. There is an overnight in Sri Lanka on the way out, to break up a long flight to Tel Aviv. On the return flight, from Israel, there are three nights in Sri Lanka and touring to take you to some of the most famous and beautiful sights in that country. On the last day you will have a relaxing day at a beach resort to prepare for the flight home the next day. This tour is a mere \$100 more than the 14 Day tour, so its very good value.


