Worship Music Notes for Sunday 21st April 2024

MUSIC NOTES

In 1866, English clergyman Samuel John Stone (1839-1900) was concerned that many of his parishioners did not understand the meaning of the Apostles Creed. This inspired him to write a set of hymns to explain each of the Articles, the "*Lyra Fidelium*". **"The Church's one foundation"** is based on Article 9, (I believe in) "The Holy Catholic Church: The Communion of Saints." The well-known tune "Aurelia" was composed by Samuel Sebastian Wesley, grandson of poet and hymn writer Charles Wesley.

The hymn, **"In heavenly love abiding"** has been described as a 'beautiful variation' on the twenty-third psalm. Originally entitled "Safety in God," the hymn was written by Anna Laetitia Waring, a Quaker who later became a member of the Church of England. She was actively involved in philanthropic work in Bristol, and had a particular concern for the welfare and rehabilitation of prisoners.

Today's Reflection sung by Cardinale is from Psalm 42: **"Sicut cervus desiderat - As the deer longs for springs of water, so longs my soul for you, O God."** The setting is by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina, a leading Italian Renaissance composer, whose works significantly influenced the development of Church music in Europe. Today's motet has been described as "an expression of serene but fervent spiritual yearning."

The hymn, **"I will sing the wondrous story"** (TIS 233) was written by American pastor, Francis Harold Rowley. Verse 2 specifically relates to today's Gospel, and the care and concern shown by Jesus for the welfare of his sheep. The hymn is sung to the well-known Welsh tune "Hyfrodol" which was written in 1830 by Welsh musician Rowland Huw Prichard.

During communion at the 9:00am Service, Cardinale will sing the Easter Carol, **"This joyful Eastertide."** English priest, George Ratcliffe Woodward (1848-1934) wrote the text to fit the music of a Dutch folk tune, "Vruechten" which was harmonised by Irish composer, Charles Wood. A feature of the tune is the lengthened setting of key words at the ends of lines: sorrow, morrow; slumber, number; river, deliver. The rising melody line at the end of the refrain is a joyful and triumphant setting for the word "arisen!"

The hymn, **"Hail Redeemer, King divine"** (TIS 237) was written by Irish Catholic priest, Fr. Patrick Brennan, C.Ss.R. (1877-1952) who moved to Western Australia in the early years of his priesthood. He wrote the hymn in 1933 for the laying of the foundation stone of Liverpool's Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King, and the verses of the hymn consider different aspects of the Kingship of Christ. In today's Gospel reading, John speaks of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and in the third verse of the hymn we sing of the Shepherd-king who brings home and shelters the wandering sheep.

SECOND READING: 1 John 3:16-24

How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.
