

Worship Music Notes for Sunday 28th January 2024 7:00am and 9:00am Service

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn writers John Bell (b.1949) and Graham Maule (b.1958) are members of the Iona Community, in Scotland, an ecumenical Christian group known for its commitment to renewal in the church's worship, and to issues of peace and justice. Their hymn, "Praise with joy the world's Creator" (TIS 179) was first sung at the opening worship service for the World Student Christian Federation at Giles Cathedral in Edinburgh in 1985. The hymn is sung to the tune, "Lauda anima" ("Praise my soul") written by John Goss (1800-1880,) an organist at St Paul's Cathedral, London. "It was said that he never began a composition without first asking for God's blessing upon his work."

Scottish Jesuit priest, Fr James Quinn SJ (1919-2010) wrote many hymns after the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) and was actively involved in ecumenical activities. It has been said that "Fr Quinn had the ability to articulate aspects of the faith in new and fresh ways," and that "his hymns and paraphrases help us better understand the mystery and presence of God in our world today." His hymn, "Father of mercy, God of consolation" (TIS 472) is a prayer for help, healing and forgiveness. It is sung to the music of an old French church melody, "Christe sanctorum."

Born in The Netherlands, hymn writer Fred Kaan (1929-2009) lived through the Nazi occupation as a child. He was ordained in the United Reformed Church in England and was passionately committed to working for, and praying for peace. He passed away after a long struggle with cancer and Alzheimer's disease. Entitled Hymn of Acceptance, "Help us accept each other" (TIS 648) has been described as "one of the most powerful hymns on reconciliation and forgiveness composed in the last half of the 20th century." Fred Kaan wrote: "One of the greatest dangers about a life of faith is the danger of there being a gap between word and deed, between worship and service, between prayer and doing our utmost to make that prayer come true."

Michael Thwaites (1915-2005) was a distinguished Australian poet and Rhodes Scholar to Oxford. His wife, Honor Mary (1914-1993) was a graduate from Melbourne University with honours in French and German. During World War II Honor assisted victims of Nazi persecution to escape to freedom in Britain. Michael and Honor together wrote the hymn, "Lord of earth and all creation" (TIS 672), which was originally titled, "For Australia." It was first sung at their church, St John the Baptist Church in Canberra, in November 1986. It has also been sung at many national services, including an Anzac Day service in Westminster Abbey and the opening of the new Parliament House by Queen Elizabeth II in May 1988.

Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet shall speak in my name, I myself will hold accountable. But any prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, or who presumes to speak in my name a word that I have not commanded the prophet to speak—that prophet shall die.'

NEW TESTAMENT READING: 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that 'all of us possess knowledge.' Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; but anyone who loves God is known by him. Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that 'no idol in the world really exists', and that 'there is no God but one.' Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords— yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist. It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. 'Food will not bring us close to God.' We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling-block to the weak. For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.


