

Worship Music Notes for Sunday 28th April 2024 7:00am and 9:00am Service

MUSIC NOTES

Today's Choir Introit, "You are the vine," was written in 1985 by American musicians Danny Daniels and Randy Rigby. It is based on today's reading from John's Gospel, where God is portrayed as a vine, and God's people are the branches.

Sr Pamela Stotter (b. 1944) is an Irish educator and composer, and a lecturer in Ecumenical Studies. Her hymn, "Christ is alive, with joy we sing" (TIS 393) contains Easter images of Christ as a grain of wheat, the living vine and the bread of life. Each verse concludes with joyful Alleluias. The hymn is sung to an uplifting tune by German Lutheran composer, Melchior Vulpius.

Dave Bilborough is an English singer/songwriter who has written many worship songs in a folk-style. He has conducted many worship workshops, and has appeared several times on 'Songs of Praise.' He writes: "Let there be love shared among us' written originally for a local event in my own home town, but has been adopted by many for use in their church worship."

Tony Alonso is a Cuban-American Catholic composer, and is also an Assistant Professor of Theology at Emory University. His music appears in many Christian hymnals throughout the world. Today's Reflection is his setting of the familiar and much loved text: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

Born in The Netherlands, and having lived through the Nazi occupation as a child, Fred Kaan was passionately committed to working for, and praying for peace, and his hymn, "Help us accept each other" (TIS 648) is based on themes of reconciliation and forgiveness. Kaan wrote: "One of the greatest dangers about a life of faith is the danger of there being a gap between word and deed, between worship and service, between prayer and doing our utmost to make that prayer come true."

In 1985, Dr John Kleinig, a lecturer at Luther Seminary in Adelaide preached a sermon on Mark 9:38-50, at the monthly Student Service. He also wrote a set of lyrics based on verse 41, "whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward." South Australian Christian song writer, Robin Mann set the text to music, which then became the hymn, "Lord Jesus, we belong to you" (TIS 686.)

Welsh Bishop, Timothy Rees (1873-1939) experienced many facets of life: a curate in mining valleys, a College lecturer, a Monastic, an army Chaplain during World War I, and a Bishop in South Wales during the Depression. His deep identification with human suffering and the compassion and triumph of God's love find expression in his hymn, "God is love, let heaven adore him" (TIS 153)

FIRST READING:

Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.)

So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship

and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah.

Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.'

So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?'

He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him.

Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter,

and like a lamb silent before its shearer,

so he does not open his mouth.

In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.'

The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus.

As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?'

He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him.

When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing.

But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

SECOND READING:

1 John 4:7-21

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Saviour of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgement, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God', and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.
